BROADLEAF WEEDS

During the course of the growing season in the Edmonton and surrounding area, we see a number of broadleaf weeds that can germinate and grow in our landscapes.

The most common broadleaf weeds include the following:



- Proper cultural methods such as: cutting, watering, aerating and fertilizing of your lawn areas will assist in keeping these weeds away
- Alternative forms of landscape such as: trees/shrubs, rock, mulch or maintained soil beds will also assist in minimizing the development and spread of weeds

INVASIVE GRASSES



Quackgrass is a perennial grass that has a creeping quality and is a common problem in Edmonton and surrounding areas. On lawns, you will notice it as a taller grass among your desired turfgrass because it tends to grow very quickly in a short amount of time. This species is known to develop large patches and once established can be difficult to eradicate.

Prevention and Management

The best way to prevent and manage quackgrass is to ensure a thick and healthy stand of grass. The thicker the lawn, the less room invasive grasses and weeds have to grow. Proper cultural methods such as: cutting, watering, aerating and fertilization will assist in minimizing the impact and establishment of quackgrass. Increased fertilizer applications during the growing season can assist in choking out the quackgrass, but will require additional mowing cycles and maintenance. The process of choking out the quackgrass can take several growing cycles or years to achieve desired results.
